Budget & Policy Priorities



LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2024

Start Early Washington works with public and private partners to promote comprehensive prenatal-to-age 5 experiences for children and families in Washington state. It is our position that all policy and budget decisions must advance racial equity and meet the needs of children and families in rural and other under-resourced communities.

START EARLY WASHINGTON'S 2024 BUDGET AND POLICY PRIORITIES INCLUDE:

Supporting Families with Home Visiting and Child Care (\$3.2M)

- As the state looks at approaches to combat the fentanyl/opioid pandemic, supporting parents through expanded home visiting is a sound policy in the state's effort to keep families together. Specifically, we support funding of up to 150 targeted contracted home visiting slots in locales with historically high rates of child welfare screened-in intakes. (\$1.6M)
- Additionally, we support \$1.6M in funding to support contracting of Working Connections Child Care slots for child protective services-involved infants. Access to child care can be a valuable resource for families and also serve as a valuable component of a safety plan.

Early Learning Facilities

 Support legislation that facilitates the co-location of affordable housing and early learning facility space and increases the threshold of grant and loan funding amounts for the Early Learning Facilities Fund.

Transition to Kindergarten Coordinated Recruitment and Enrollment (\$1.4M)

 Provide funding to implement the Coordinated Recruitment and Enrollment components of the Transition to Kindergarten legislation, allowing local partners to coordinate and communicate to increase access to pre-K through our state's mixed delivery system.
