

Establishing Coaching Behaviors for Home Visitors: An e-Delphi Study

Start Early's Communities of Practice – Home Visitor Professional Development

Introduction

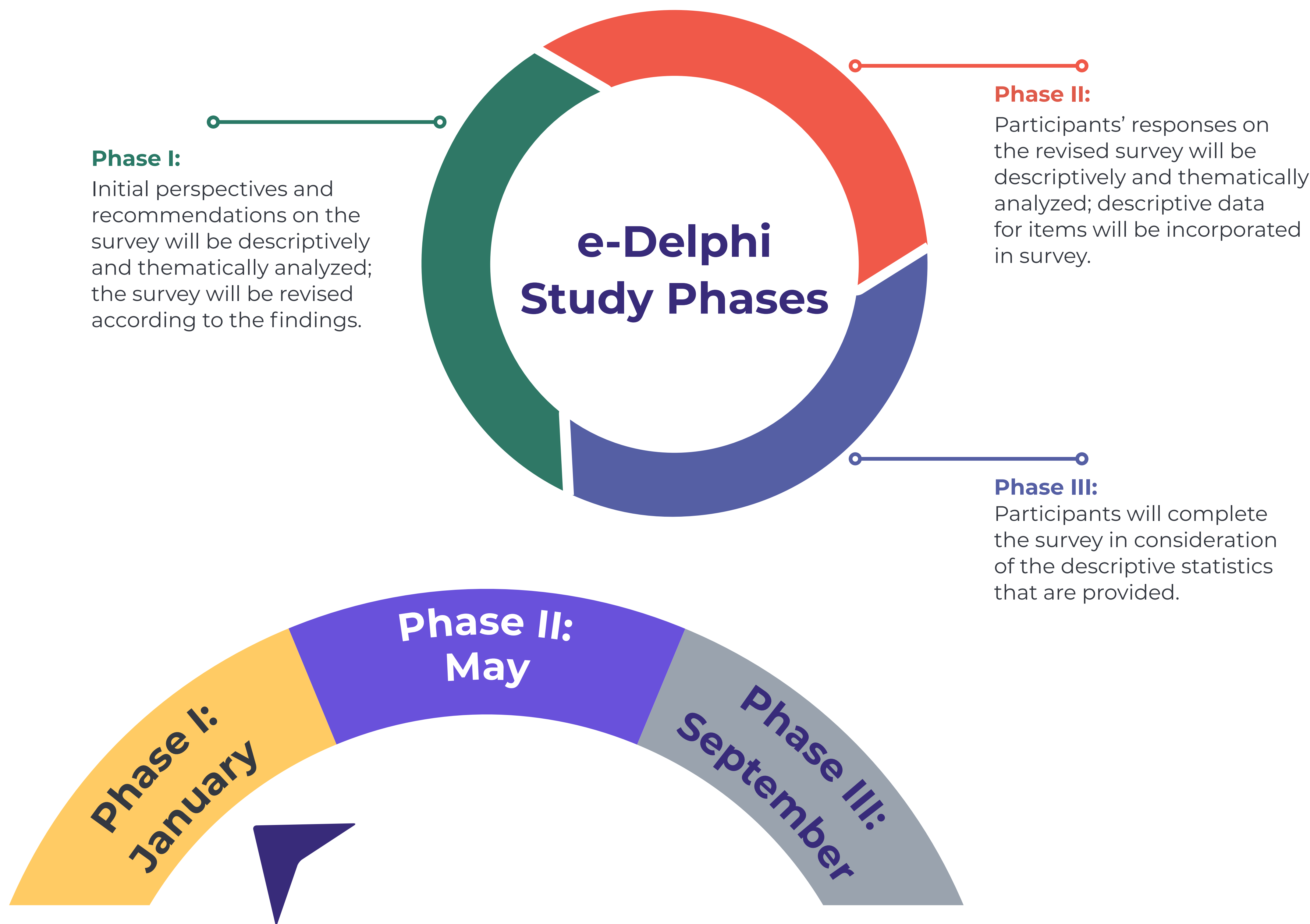
Coaching is a pivotal process in home visiting, yet it is understudied. This study aims to identify coaching strategies for those that are responsive to home visitors' unique training needs and contexts. Utilizing an e-Delphi approach (Eubank et al., 2016; Keeney et al., 2011; Rives et al., 2020) perspectives about applicable and essential coaching behaviors will be elicited from those on the frontline of practice and research.

Measure

The Coaching for Fostering Home Visitor Competence Survey (CoP-PD, 2022) was designed for iterative elicitation of home visiting professionals' perspectives for the purpose of identifying a set of coaching behaviors specific for home visitors.

Participant Selection: Sampling

A minimum of 20 participants available for all three phases and an equal representation of program administrators, supervisors, home visitors, and researchers. Recruitment through Home Visiting Applied Research Collaborative (HARC) yielded 96 possible participants. Selection is underway
